Dear Friends and Supporters of the Bluff Park Historic Lamppost Project:

The BPNA has exciting news to share! The manufacturing of the 1st phase lampposts has now started with the newly re-organized Union Metal Industries Corporation. This is the company that originally made the neighborhood's E. 1st Street lampposts almost a century ago.

Let us recap 2018 and tell you about 2019:

RECAP OF 2018

Exactly a year ago to the week, last December 2017 we got word of Union Metal Corporation's financial issues resulting in its abrupt shutdown. You may recall that we had been expecting the 1st phase lampposts to ship to us just a couple months later.

Undeterred by this setback, the *Project*'s committee and the BPNA Board worked diligently and swiftly with the City and community and received bids from other interested streetlight manufacturers. Having read of the personal impacts of Union Metal's closing, we reached out to our lampposts' designer Mike Basiewicz whose sad story was featured in the local Ohio news. As the months passed, we learned from Mike that the company had been acquired, re-organized and re-opened at its same location where it started in 1906. Since the summer 2018, the company is now fully up and running; we secured a new and competitive bid; and we are now working again with Union Metal. Even Mike is back with the company.... and our *Project*!

A few months ago, we walked the streets with the City and its contracted installer and reached out to all of the homeowners along Paloma Avenue to clarify and review the specific installation locations.

COMING IN 2019

We expect that the ten (10) first-phase lampposts will arrive in the second quarter of 2019. The City will fit them with the same energy-saving LED fixtures that have been in-place and demonstrated since June 2017 at the corner of Paloma Ave and E. 1st St. Once the new lampposts are installed, we will have a public dedication celebration, sponsored in part by a Port of Long Beach grant awarded to the BPNA, sometime in mid-2019. Stay tuned!
